It's "Ciao" to the Chumps!

Ciao! to all the Sons. My name is Hugo and I'm a camel. Years ago I was sitting, sad and alone, in a small market-place. Nobody wanted me. But one fine day two crazy "Chumps" looked straight into my eyes and decided I should represent all the Tent's "Chumps"! So, I'm the best one to tell you the story of the "A Chump at Oxford" Italian Tent.

The idea to establish a Sons tent in Italy was born in the city of Modena in 1992. Modena is a town located in Northern Italy. It is famous around the world for the sportcar factories (Ferrari, Maserati), balsamic vinegar and because this is the birthplace of tenor Luciano Pavarotti.



1993, in our first dinner meeting. Tiziano, our Grand Sheik had met Dr. McCabe during the Sons fabulous European Convention in Rolduc, Nederland in 1993.

During our meetings which are usually two each year, we start with a couple of absolutely out of tune trumpet blasts. Enzo Zaccarelli is our official, terrible trumpeter! The tent's "Chumps" do a lot of toasts, introducing them with the famous refrain "Good morning to you, good morning dear teacher" sung in Pardon Us.

On our first anniversary, the most important Italian movie magazine "CIAK" published an interesting article about us. It brought us many new members and officially acquainted

all of Italy with our existence. One year later, the mayor of Baricella, a historical town not far from Modena invited us to organize a great event to honor "Stanlio & Ollio". The event included sessions explaining who Laurel and Hardy were, art competitions about the Boys for children, films shown in the cinemas and the first public pie-fight (more than 1,300 cakes)! This was such an amusing and crazy event, it made us well known throughout Italy organizing events that celebrated Laurel & Hardy including more pie-fights. After the Acquivia Picena's pie-fight we were listed in the Guinness Book of Records in

They then showed the premiere of *On The Loose* (1931) with live dubbing by Sons Alessandro, Francesca, Mary and Simone. This was the first time it was shown to an Italian audience and an Italian dub doesn't exist. The Grand Sheik described the Boys mis-adventures with women, on and off the screen and answered questions. The final film was Twice Two (1932). The laughing continued loudly throughout the film. 
Son Shines



The program started with the showing of Winsor cartoonist McCay's 1914 film Gertie the Dinosaur. I was the Trainer with a tuxedo and a whip, sharing laughs and cheers with the audience. We were honoring Jacovitti, one of Italy's finest



cartoonists, on the 90th anniversary of his birth. We then showed Laurel and Hardy's films *Wrong Again* (1929) and the rarely seen in Italy, *Angora Love* (1929). Our final film was *The Chimp* (1929). We carefully chose the films that were restored versions with original titles. We created the sub-titles "live" and explained the frequent use of animals in the Boys' pictures. At the conclusion of the evening we had a buffet and a brief raffle. We then went to a restaurant to celebrate. In 2006, 85 years after *Lucky Dog* (1922) was filmed and almost 80 years from when Stan and Babe were paired at the Roach Studios, a new Sons of the Desert tent was founded in Prato, near Firenze, Italy. Men and women of all ages were welcomed. I am the Grand Sheik of the Block-Heads tent, Oasis #258. We have a number of other officers who run the tent including Alessio Santi, Alberto Vangelisti, Francesa Noci, and others.
